- Listen to the speaker






We LOVE to celebrate birthdays!

KEEP

- Given one-on-one with teacher twice a year- before school and May.
- All students need to be tested BEFORE school begins
- There are some no school days for kindergarteners in the spring to accommodate this testing

Acadeince Reading (DIBELS) Acadeince Math

- Given three time per year-August, December, and April/May
- Tests for general math and reading skills
- Used as a screener to identify students who may need intervention.

I-Ready Diagnostic

- Given three times per year-August, December, and May.
- Computer test that is adaptive- meaning the questions work to level your child wherever they are performing.
- Tests concepts that are formally taught during math instruction time



Guiding Principles

•Grades are tied to specific standards and objectives.

•Grades should be accurate and reflect proficiency in those course standards.

•Homework is for practice and parent communication and is not graded.

•Students are given multiple opportunities to show proficiency in each standard.

•Students will be allowed to demonstrate knowledge using multiple modalities.

•No extra credit.



Highly Proficient-4 | exceed expectations and can apply the standard in complex ways

Proficient-3 I meet the expectations described in the standard and can do them independently.

Approaching Proficient-2 I am getting close to meeting expectations and can do the simpler parts of the standard independently.

Below Proficient-1 I still need help and support from my teacher to do the simpler parts of the standard.

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Standard: Students will ride their bike unassisted without falling or stopping.



Some standards are foundational skills and it is not possible to get a 4.
